

The Fear of the Lord Verses

1. Genesis 22:12 – “Don’t lay a hand on the boy!” the angel said. “Do not hurt him in any way, for now I know that you truly fear God. You have not withheld from Me even your son, your only son.”

2. Genesis 42:18 – On the third day Joseph said to them, “I am a God-fearing man. If you do as I say, you will live.

3. Exodus 1:17 & 21 – But because the midwives feared God, they refused to obey the king’s orders. They allowed the boys to live, too. And because the midwives fear God, He gave them families of their own.

4. Exodus 18: 21 – But select from all the people some capable, honest men who fear God and hate bribes. Appoint them as leaders over groups of one thousand, one hundred, fifty, and ten.

5. Exodus 20:18 – When the people heard the thunder and the loud blast of the ram’s horn, and when they saw the flashes of lightening and the smoke billowing from the mountain, they stood at a distance, trembling with fear.

6. Exodus 20:20 – “Don’t be afraid,” Moses answered them, “for God has come in this way to test you, and so that your fear of Him will keep you from sinning!”

7. Leviticus 19:14 – Do not insult the deaf or cause the blind to stumble. You must fear your God; I am the Lord.

8. Leviticus 25:17 – Show your fear of God by not taking advantage of each other. I am the Lord your God.

9. Deuteronomy 4:10 – Never forget the day when you stood before the Lord your God at Mount Sinai, where He told me, “Summon the people before Me, and I will personally instruct them. Then they will learn to fear me as long as they live, and they will teach their children to fear Me also.

10. Deuteronomy 5:28-29 – The Lord heard the request you made to me. And He said, “I have heard what the people said to you, and they are right. Oh, that they would always have hearts like this, that they might fear Me and obey all My commands! If they did, they and their descendants would prosper forever.”

11. Deuteronomy 6:24 – And the Lord our God commanded us to obey all these decrees and to fear Him so He can continue to bless us and preserve our lives, as He has done to this day.

12. Deuteronomy 8:6 – So obey the commands of the Lord your God by walking in His ways and fearing Him.

13. Deuteronomy 10:12-21 – And now, Israel, what does the Lord your God require of you? He requires only that you fear the Lord your God, and live in a way that pleases Him, and love Him and serve Him with all your heart and soul. And you must always obey the Lord's commands and decrees that I am giving you today for your own good. Look, the highest heavens and the earth and everything in it all belong to the Lord your God. Yet the Lord chose your ancestors as the objects of His love. And He chose you, their descendants, above all other nations, as is evident today. Therefore, change your hearts and stop being stubborn. For the Lord your God is the God of gods and Lord of lords. He is the great God, the mighty and awesome God, who shows no partiality and cannot be bribed. He ensures that orphans and widows receive justice. He shows love to the foreigners living among you and gives them food and clothing. So, you, too, must show love to foreigners, for you yourselves were once foreigners in the land of Egypt. You must fear the Lord your God and worship Him and cling to Him. Your oaths must be in His name alone. He alone is your God, the only one who is worthy of your praise, the one who has done these mighty miracles that you have seen with your own eyes.

14. Deuteronomy 13:4 – Serve only the Lord your God and fear Him alone. Obey His commands, listen to His voice, and cling to Him.

15. Deuteronomy 14:23 – Bring this tithe to the designated place of worship – the place the Lord your God chooses for His name to be honored – and eat it there in His presence. This applies to your tithes of grain, new wine, olive oil, and the firstborn males of your flocks and herds. Doing this will teach you always to fear the Lord your God.

16. Deuteronomy 17:18-20 – When he sits on the throne as king, he must copy for himself this body of instruction on a scroll in the presence of the Levitical priests. He must always keep that copy with him and read it daily as long as he lives. That way he will learn to fear the Lord his God by obeying all the terms of these instructions and decrees. This regular reading will prevent him from becoming proud and acting as if he is above his fellow citizens. It will also prevent him from turning away from these commands in the smallest way. And it will ensure that he and his descendants will reign for many generations in Israel.

17. Deuteronomy 31:11-13 – You must read this Book of Instruction to all the people of Israel when they assemble before the Lord your God at the place He chooses. Call them all together – men, women, children, and foreigners living in your towns – so they may hear this Book of Instruction and learn to fear the Lord your God and carefully obey all the terms of these instructions. Do this so that your children who have not known these instructions will hear them and will learn to fear the Lord your God. Do this as long as you live in the land you are crossing the Jordan to occupy.

18. Joshua 4:24 – He did this so all the nations of the earth might know that the Lord's hand is powerful, and so you might fear the Lord your God forever.

19 Joshua 24:14 – So fear the Lord and serve Him wholeheartedly. Put away forever the idols your ancestors worshiped when they lived beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt. Serve the Lord alone.

20. 1 Samuel 12:14 – Now if you fear and worship the Lord and listen to His voice, and if you do not rebel against the Lord's commands, then both you and your king will show that you recognize the Lord as your God.

21. 1 Samuel 12:24 – But be sure to fear the Lord and faithfully serve Him. Think of all the wonderful things He has done for you.

22. 1 Kings 8:38-40 – And if Your people Israel pray about their troubles, raising their hands towards this Temple, then hear from heaven where You live, and forgive. Give Your people what their actions deserve, for You alone know each human heart. Then they will fear You as long as they live in the land You gave to our ancestors.

23. 1 Kings 8:41-43 – In the future, foreigners who do not belong to Your people Israel will hear of You. They will come from distant lands because of Your Name, for they will hear of Your Great Name and Your strong hand and Your powerful arm. And when they pray toward this Temple, then hear from heaven where you live, and grant what they ask of You. In this way, all the people of the earth will come to know and fear You, just as Your own people Israel do. They, too, will know that this Temple I have built honors Your Name.

24. 1 Chronicles 16:23-25 – Let the whole earth sing to the Lord! Each day proclaim the good news that He saves. Publish His glorious deeds among the nations. Tell everyone about the amazing things He does. Great is the Lord! He is most worthy of praise! He is to be feared above all gods.

25. 2 Chronicles 17:9-10 – They took copies of the Book of the Law of the Lord and traveled around through all the towns of Judah, teaching the people. Then the fear of the Lord fell over all the surrounding kingdoms so that none of them wanted to declare war on Jehoshaphat.

26. 2 Chronicles 19:7 & 9 – Fear the Lord and judge with integrity, for the Lord you God does not tolerate perverted justice, partiality, or the taking of bribes. ... You must always act in the fear of the Lord, with faithfulness and an undivided heart.

27. 2 Chronicles 26:5 – Uzziah sought God during the days of Zechariah, who taught him to fear God. And as long as the king sought guidance from the Lord, God gave him success.

28. Nehemiah 1:10-11 – The people You rescued by Your great power and strong hand are Your servants. O Lord, please hear my prayer! Listen to the prayers of those of us who delight in honoring You. Please grant me success today...

29. Nehemiah 5:9 – Then I pressed further, “What you are doing is not right! Should you not walk in the fear of our God in order to avoid being mocked by enemy nations?”

30. Nehemiah 5:15 – The former governors, in contrast, had laid heavy burdens on the people, demanding a daily ration of food and wine, besides forty pieces of silver. Even their assistants took advantage of the people. But because I fear God, I did not act that way.

31. Job 1:1 – There was once a man named Job who lived in the land of Uz. He was blameless – a man of complete integrity. He feared God and stayed away from evil.

32. Job 2:3 – Then the Lord said to Satan, “Have you noticed My servant Job? He is the finest man in all the earth. He is blameless – a man of complete integrity. He fears God and stays away from evil. And he has maintained his integrity, even though you urged Me to harm him without cause.”

33. Job 4:6 – Doesn’t your reverence for God give you confidence? Doesn’t your life of integrity give you hope?

34. Job 28:28 – And this is what he says to all humanity: “the fear of the Lord is true wisdom; to forsake evil is real understanding.

35. Job 37:23-24 – We cannot even imagine the power of the Almighty; but even though He is just and righteous, He does not destroy us. No wonder people everywhere fear Him. All who are wise show Him reverence.

36. Psalm 2:11 – Serve the Lord with reverent fear and rejoice with trembling.

37. Psalm 19:9 – Reverence for the Lord is pure, lasting forever. The laws of the Lord are true; each one is fair.

38. Psalm 22:23 – Praise the Lord, all you who fear Him! Honor Him, all you descendants of Jacob! Show Him reverence, all you descendants of Israel!

39. Psalm 25:12 – Who are those who fear the Lord? He will show them the path they should choose.

40. Psalm 25:14-15 - The Lord is a friend to those who fear Him. He teaches them His covenant. My eyes are always on the Lord, for He rescues me from the traps of my enemies.

41. Psalm 31:19-20 – How great is the goodness You have stored up for those who fear You. You lavish it on those who come to You for protection, blessing them before the watching world. You hide them in the shelter of Your presence, safe from those who conspire against them. You shelter them in Your presence, far from accusing tongues.

42. Psalm 33:6-9 – The Lord merely spoke, and the heavens were created. He breathed the word, and all the stars were born. He assigned the sea its boundaries and locked the oceans in vast reservoirs. Let the whole world fear the Lord and let everyone stand in awe of Him. For when He spoke, the world began! It appeared at His command.

43. Psalm 33:18-19 – But the Lord watches over those who fear Him, those who rely on His unfailing love. He rescues them from death and keeps them alive in times of famine.

44. Psalm 34 – I will praise the Lord at all times. I will constantly speak His praises. I will boast only in the Lord; let all who are helpless take heart. Come, let us tell of the Lord's greatness; let us exalt His name together. I prayed to the Lord, and He answered me. He freed me from all my fears. Those who look to Him for help will be radiant with joy; no shadow of shame will darken their faces. In my desperation, I prayed, and the Lord listened; He saved me from all my troubles. For the angel of the Lord is a guard; He surrounds and defends all who fear Him. Taste and see that the Lord is good. Oh, the joys of those who take refuge in Him! Fear the Lord, you His godly people, for those who fear Him will have all they need. Even strong young lions sometimes go hungry, but those who fear the Lord will lack no good thing. Come my children and listen to me, and I will teach you to fear the Lord. Does anyone want to live a life that is long and prosperous? Then keep your tongue from speaking evil and your lips from telling lies! Turn away from evil and do good. Search for peace and work to maintain it. The eyes of the Lord watch over those who do right; His ears are open to their cries for help. But the Lord turns His face against those who do evil; He will erase their memory from the earth. The Lord hears His people when they cry to Him for help. He rescues them from all their troubles. The Lord is close to the brokenhearted; He rescues those whose spirits are crushed. The righteous face many troubles, but the Lord comes to the rescue each time. For the Lord protects the bones of the righteous; not one of them is broken! Calamity will surely destroy the wicked,

and those who hate the righteous will be punished. But the Lord will redeem those who serve Him. No one who takes refuge in Him will be condemned.

45. Psalm 60:4 – But You have raised a banner for those who fear You – a rallying point in the face of attack.

46. Psalm 61:5 – For You have heard my vows, oh God. You have given me an inheritance reserved for those who fear Your Name.

47. Psalm 85:9 – Surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him, so our land will be filled with His glory.

48. Psalm 86:11 -Teach me Your ways, oh Lord, that I may live according to Your truth! Grant me purity of heart, so that I may honor You.

49. Psalm 90:11-12 – Who can comprehend the power of Your anger? Your wrath is as awesome as the fear You deserve. Teach us to realize the brevity of life, so that we may grow in wisdom.

50. Psalm 96:4 – Great is the Lord! He is most worthy of praise! He is to be feared above all gods.

51. Psalm 103:8-13 – The Lord is compassionate and merciful, slow to get angry and filled with unfailing love. He will not constantly accuse us, nor remain angry forever. He does not punish us for all our sins; he does not deal harshly with us, as we deserve. For His unfailing love toward those who fear Him is as great as the height of the heavens above the earth. He has removed our sins as far from us as the east is from the west. The Lord is like a father to His children, tender and compassionate to those who fear Him.

52. Psalms 111 - Praise the LORD! I will thank the LORD with all my heart as I meet with his godly people. How amazing are the deeds of the LORD! All who delight in him should ponder them. Everything he does reveals his glory and majesty. His righteousness never fails. He causes us to remember his wonderful works. How gracious and merciful is our LORD! He gives food to those who fear him; he always remembers his covenant. He has shown his great power to his people by giving them the lands of other nations. All he does is just and good, and all his commandments are trustworthy. They are forever true, to be obeyed faithfully and with integrity. He has paid a full ransom for his people. He has guaranteed his covenant with them forever. What a holy, awe-inspiring name he has! Fear of the LORD is the foundation of true wisdom. All who obey his commandments will grow in wisdom. Praise him forever!

53. Psalm 112:1 – Praise the Lord! How joyful are those who fear the Lord and delight in obeying His commands.

54. Psalm 115:11 – All you who fear the Lord, trust the Lord! He is your helper and your shield.

55. Psalm 118:4 – Let all who fear the Lord repeat: “His faithful love endures forever.”

56. Psalm 119:38 – Reassure me of Your promise, made to those who fear You.

57. Psalm 119:63 – I am a friend to anyone who fears You – anyone who obeys Your commandments.

58. Psalm 119:74 – May all who fear You find in me a cause for joy, for I have put my hope in Your Word.

59. Psalm 119:120 – I tremble in fear of You; I stand in awe of Your regulations.

60. Psalm 128:1-2 – How joyful are those who fear the Lord – all who follow His ways! You will enjoy the fruit of your labor. How joyful and prosperous you will be!

61. Psalm 130:3-4 – Lord, if You kept a record of our sins, who, oh Lord, could ever survive? But You offer forgiveness, that we might learn to fear You!

62. Psalm 135:20 – Oh Levites, praise the Lord! All you who fear the Lord, praise the Lord!

63. Psalm 145:19 – He grants the desires of those who fear Him; He hears their cries for help and rescues them.

64. Psalm 147:11 – No, the Lord’s delight is in those who fear Him, those who put their hope in His unfailing love.

65. Proverbs 1:7 – Fear of the Lord is the foundation of true knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline.

66. Proverbs 2:2-6 – Tune your ear to wisdom and concentrate on understanding...Then you will understand what it means to fear the Lord, and you will gain knowledge of God. For the Lord grants wisdom! From His mouth come knowledge and understanding.

67. Proverbs 3:7-8 – Don’t be impressed with your own wisdom. Instead, fear the Lord and turn away from evil. Then you will have healing for your body and strength for your bones.

68. Proverbs 8:13 – All who fear the Lord will hate evil, Therefore, I hate pride and arrogance, corruption and perverse speech.

69. Proverbs 9:10 – Fear of the Lord is the foundation of wisdom. Knowledge of the Holy One results in good judgement.

70. Proverbs 10:27 – Fear of the Lord lengthens one's life, but the years of the wicked are cut short.

71. Proverbs 14:2 – Those who follow the right path fear the Lord; those who take the wrong path despise Him.

72. Proverbs 14:26-27 – Those who fear the Lord are secure; He will be a refuge for their children. Fear of the Lord is a life-giving fountain; it offers escape from the snares of death.

73. Proverbs 15:16 – Better to have little, with fear of the Lord, than to have great treasure and inner turmoil.

74. Proverbs 15:33 – Fear of the Lord teaches wisdom; humility precedes honor.

75. Proverbs 16:6 – Unfailing love and faithfulness make atonement for sin. By fearing the Lord, people avoid evil.

76. Proverbs 19:23 – Fear of the Lord leads to life, bringing security and protection from harm.

77. Proverbs 22:4 – True humility and fear of the Lord lead to riches, honor, and long life.

78. Proverbs 23:17-18 – Don't envy sinners, but always continue to fear the Lord. You will be rewarded for this; your hope will not be disappointed.

79. Proverbs 24:21 – My child, fear the Lord and the king. Don't associate with rebels.

80. Proverbs 28:13-14 – People who conceal their sins will not prosper, but if they confess and turn from them, they will receive mercy. Blessed are those who fear to do wrong, but the stubborn are headed for serious trouble.

81. Proverbs 29:25 – Fearing people is a dangerous trap, but trusting the Lord means safety.

82. Proverbs 31:30 – Charm is deceptive, and beauty does not last; but a woman who fears the Lord will be greatly praised.

83. Ecclesiastes 3:14 – And I know that whatever God does is final! Nothing can be added to it or taken from it. God’s purpose is that people should fear Him.

84. Ecclesiastes 5:7 – Talk is cheap, like daydreams and other useless activities. Fear God instead.

85. Ecclesiastes 8:12-13 – But even though a person sins a hundred times and still lives a long time, I know that those who fear God will be better off. The wicked will not prosper, for they do not fear God. Their days will never grow long like the evening shadows.

86. Ecclesiastes 12:13-14 – That’s the whole story. Here now is my final conclusion: Fear God and obey His commands, for this is everyone’s duty. God will judge us for everything we do, including every secret thing, whether good or bad.

87. Isaiah 8:11-13 – The Lord has given me a strong warning not to think like everyone else does. He said, “Don’t call everything a conspiracy, like they do, and don’t live in dread of what frightens them. Make the Lord of Heaven’s Armies holy in your life. He is the One you should fear. He is the One who should make you tremble.

88. Isaiah 11:2-3 – And the Spirit of the Lord will rest on Him – the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, and the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. He will delight in obeying the Lord...

89. Isaiah 25:3 – Therefore, strong nations will declare Your glory; ruthless nations will fear You.

90. Isaiah 33:5-6 – Though the Lord is very great and lives in heaven, He will make Jerusalem His home of justice and righteousness. In that day He will be your sure foundation, providing a rich store of salvation, wisdom, and knowledge. The fear of the Lord will be your treasure.

91. Isaiah 50:10 – Who among you fears the Lord and obeys His servant? If you are walking in darkness, without a ray of light, trust in the Lord and rely on your God.

92. Isaiah 57:11 – Are you afraid of these idols? Do they terrify you? Is that why you have lied to Me and forgotten Me and My words? Is it because of My long silence that you no longer fear Me?

93. Jeremiah 2:19 – Your wickedness will bring its own punishment. Your turning from Me will shame you. You will see what an evil, bitter thing it is to abandon the Lord you God and not fear Him. I, the Lord, the Lord of Heaven’s Armies, have spoken!

94. Jeremiah 3:8 – She saw that I divorced faithless Israel because of her adultery. But that treacherous sister Judah had no fear, and now she, too, has left Me and given herself to prostitution.

95. Jeremiah 10:7 – Who would not fear You, oh King of nations? That title belongs to You alone! Among all the wise people of the earth and in all the kingdoms of the world, there is no one like You.

96. Daniel 6:26 – I decree that everyone throughout my kingdom should tremble with fear before the God of Daniel. For He is the living God, and He will endure forever. His kingdom will never be destroyed, and His rule will never end.

97. Micah 6:9 – Fear the Lord if you are wise! His voice calls to everyone in Jerusalem: “The armies of destruction are coming; the Lord is sending them.”

98. Micah 7:17 – Like snakes crawling from their holes, they will come out to meet the Lord our God. They will fear Him greatly, trembling in terror at His presence.

99. Haggai 1:12 – Then Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, and Jeshua son of Jehozadak, the high priest, and the whole remnant of God’s people began to obey the message from the Lord their God. When they heard the words of the prophet Haggai, whom the Lord their God had sent, the people feared the Lord.

100. Malachi 3:5 – “At that time I will put you on trial. I am eager to witness against all sorcerers and adulterers and liars. I will speak against those who cheat employees of their wages, who oppress widows and orphans, or who deprive the foreigners living among you of justice, for these people do not fear Me,” says the Lord of Heaven’s Armies.

101. Malachi 3:16-17 – Then those who feared the Lord spoke with each other, and the Lord listened to what they said. In His presence, a scroll of remembrance was written to record the names of those who feared Him and always thought about the honor of His name.

102. Malachi 4:2 – But for you who fear my Name, the Sun of Righteousness will rise with healing in His wings. And you will go free, leaping with joy like calves let out to pasture.

103. Matthew 10:26-31 – But don’t be afraid of those who threaten you. For the time is coming when everything that is covered up will be revealed, and all that is secret will be made known to all. What I tell you now in the darkness, shout abroad when daybreak comes. What I whisper in your ear, shout from the housetops for all to hear! Don’t be afraid of those who want to kill your body; they cannot touch your soul. Fear only God, who can destroy both soul and body in hell. What is the price of two sparrows – one copper coin? But not a single sparrow can fall to the ground without

your Father knowing it. And the very hairs on your head are all numbered. So, don't be afraid; you are more valuable to God than a whole flock of sparrows!

104. Mark 10:32 – They were now on the way up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them. The disciples were filled with awe, and the people following behind were overwhelmed with fear. Taking the twelve disciples aside, Jesus once more began to describe everything that was about to happen to Him.

105. Luke 1:50 – He shows mercy from generation to generation to all who fear Him.

106. Luke 7:16 – Great fear swept the crowd, and they praised God, saying, “A mighty prophet has risen among us,” and “God has visited His people today.”

107. Luke 12:4-5 – Dear friends, don't be afraid of those who want to kill your body; they cannot do any more to you after that. But I'll tell you whom to fear. Fear God, who has the power to kill you and then throw you into hell. Yes, He's the one to fear!

108. Luke 18:4 – The judge ignored her for a while, but finally he said to himself, “I don't fear God or care about people, but this woman is driving me crazy. I'm going to see that she gets justice, because she is wearing me out with her constant requests.”

109. Luke 23:40 – But the other criminal protested, “Don't you fear God even when you have been sentenced to die?”

110. Acts 9:31 – The church then had peace throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria, and it became stronger as the believers lived in the fear of the Lord. And with the encouragement of the Holy Spirit, it also grew in numbers.

111. Acts 10:34-36 – Then Peter replied, “I see very clearly that God shows no favoritism. In every nation He accepts those who fear Him and do what is right. This is the message of Good News for the people of Israel – that there is peace with God through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all.

112. Acts 17:4 – Some of the Jews who listened were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, along with many God-fearing Greek men and quite a few prominent women.

113. Acts 19:17 – The story of what happened spread quickly all through Ephesus, to Jews and Greeks alike. A solemn fear descended on the city, and the name of the Lord Jesus was greatly honored.

114. Romans 3:16-18 – Destruction and misery always follow them. They don't know where to find peace. They have no fear of God at all.

115. 2 Corinthians 5:11 – Because we understand our fearful responsibility to the Lord, we work hard to persuade others. God knows we are sincere, and I hope you know this too.

116. 2 Corinthians 7:1 – Because we have these promises, dear friends, let us cleanse ourselves from everything that can defile our body or spirit. And let us work toward complete holiness because we fear God.

117. Philippians 2:12-13 – ... Work hard to show the results of your salvation, obeying God with deep reverence and fear. For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases Him.

118. Hebrews 12:28-29 – Since we are receiving a Kingdom that is unshakable, let us be thankful and please God by worshiping Him with holy fear and awe. For our God is a Devouring Fire!

119. 1 Peter 1:17 – And remember that the heavenly Father to whom you pray has no favorites. He will judge or reward you according to what you do. So, you must live in reverent fear of Him during your time here as “temporary residents.”

120. 1 Peter 2:15-17 – It is God’s will that your honorable lives should silence those ignorant people who make foolish accusations against you. For you are free, yet you are God’s slaves, so don’t use your freedom as an excuse to do evil. Respect everyone and love the family of believers. Fear God and respect the king.

121. 1 Peter 5:5-7 – “God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.” So, humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the right time He will lift you up in honor. Give all your worries and cares to God, for He cares about you.

122. 1 John 4:17-18 – And as we live in God, our love grows more perfect. So, we will not be afraid on the day of judgement, but we can face Him with confidence because we live like Jesus here in this world. Such love has no fear, because perfect love expels all fear. If we are afraid, it is for fear of punishment, and this shows that we have not fully experienced His perfect love.

123. Revelation 11:17-18 – And they said, “We give thanks to You, Lord God, the Almighty, the One who is and who always was, for now You have assumed Your great power and have begun to reign. The nations were filled with wrath, but now the time of Your wrath has come. It is time to judge the dead and reward Your servants the prophets, as well as Your holy people, and all who fear Your Name, from the least to the greatest. It is time to destroy all who have caused destruction on the earth.”

124. Revelation 14:7 – “Fear God,” he shouted, “Give glory to Him. For the time has come when He will sit as judge. Worship Him who made the heavens, the earth, the sea, and all the springs of water.”

125. Revelation 15:4 – Who will not fear You, Lord, and glorify Your Name? For You alone are holy. All nations will come and worship before You, for Your righteous deeds have been revealed.”

126. Revelation 19:5 – And from the throne came a voice that said, “Praise our God, all His servants, all who fear Him, from the least to the greatest.”
