Part 1 – Divine Mathematics: The Necessity Of Love

The one thing the devil cannot counterfeit is love for the glory of God.

Part 2 – The Nature Of Love

- Love is patient and kind
- Love does not boast or envy
- Love is not proud or rude
- Love is not self-seeking
- Love is not easily angered and keeps no record of wrong
- Love does not delight in evil, but rejoices with the truth
- Love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres
- Love never fails

Love is cross-shaped.

"This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters." -1 John 3:16

Part 3 – The Greatness Of Love
