

## Part 1: How's Your Flame?

Leviticus 6:8-13

8 The Lord said to Moses: 9 "Give Aaron and his sons this command: 'These are the regulations for the burnt offering: The burnt offering is to remain on the altar hearth throughout the night, till morning, and the **fire** must be kept burning on the altar. 10 The priest shall then put on his linen clothes, with linen undergarments next to his body, and shall remove the ashes of the burnt offering that the **fire** has consumed on the altar and place them beside the altar. 11 Then he is to take off these clothes and put on others, and carry the ashes outside the camp to a place that is ceremonially clean. 12 The **fire** on the altar must be kept burning; it must not go out. Every morning the priest is to add firewood and arrange the burnt offering on the **fire** and burn the fat of the fellowship offerings on it. 13 The **fire** must be kept burning on the altar continuously; it must not go out.

Luke 24:30-32

When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. 32 They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"



# Part 1: How's Your Flame?

## Discussion Questions:

1. Pastor Jamie described being “on fire” as having a passion, hunger, and desire to know God that goes deeper than just emotions. Can you share about a time when you felt particularly close to God? How can you continue that connection into your daily life?
2. The message emphasized personal responsibility in maintaining your own spiritual fire. How do you personally take responsibility for keeping your spiritual fire burning, and what challenges do you face in doing so?
3. Pastor Jamie encouraged self-reflection on the condition of your spiritual fire and how it is influenced by your daily life. What do you notice in your life when your spiritual fire is flickering?
4. Pastor Jamie discussed the need to “add fresh wood to your fire”—new experiences and practices, like reading scripture or focusing on prayer—to keep the flame burning. Can you set a specific goal for yourself this week to add fresh wood to your fire? What will that be?
5. The message mentioned the importance of having a quiet time with God. What does your quiet time with God look like, and how does it help you Fan the Flame of your faith?

## Ministry Time:

Pastor Jamie spoke about seeing yourself as a “fireplace of faith”. Pray for anyone who feels like their flame of faith has been weakening over the past season of their life.

The message taught that a strong spiritual fire can drive away evil and compromise. Pray for anyone who needs to strengthen their fire to help fight against specific temptations or attacks of the enemy.
