Discussion Questions:

How has reading the book and watching this series encouraged your faith?

Share about how God has brought gold out of the fire of the hard times from your past.

Think about how you have responded to hard times in the past. How did your response reflect the goodness God? Are their people you need to repent to for mis-representing God during those seasons of your life?

Why is it so important to the Father that we show mercy and forgiveness to others, even when they don't deserve it? What would have happened in Job's world if he hadn't been willing to pray for his friends?

Just as Job was a wounded healer—an Ugly Priest—how can you aspire to do the same for those around you? What is one step you can take to become an Ugly Priest?

Ministry Time:

Pray for those who have a clear "one step" to take from the last question.

Pastor Jamie said you are never more like your Heavenly Father than when you choose to forgive someone. Pray for those who are struggling with forgiving someone else in their life. "To get right with God, these friends must first get right with Job. Job, acting as their Priest, offers the sacrifices they've brought and prays for them as Christ on the cross cried out, 'Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing' (Luke 23:34). From the beginning to the end, Job has been filled with the story of the cross, now ending with another sacrifice that pleases God and reconciles Job's friends both to himself and to God."
