God Gifts the Willing

“Now therefore go, and I will be with thy mouth, and teach thee what thou shalt say.”—**Exodus 4:12**

“Then the LORD put forth his hand, and touched my mouth. And the LORD said unto me, Behold, I have put my words in thy mouth.” —
Jeremiah 1:9

Both Moses and Jeremiah felt unqualified.
Moses said, “I am not eloquent” (**Exod. 4:10**).

Jeremiah said, “I cannot speak: for I am a child” (**Jer. 1:6**). God did not remove their weakness — He filled it.

God never asks for ability — He asks for availability.

God does not look for polished lips, but yielded mouths.

When God calls, He also supplies. When God sends, He also speaks through the sent. What He did for Moses and Jeremiah, He still does for every surrendered servant today.

God does not call the gifted — He gifts the called.

Balaam's Donkey – God speaks through the weak.

Numbers 22:28– “And the LORD opened the mouth of the ass, and she said unto Balaam...”

God used the least likely mouth in the Bible to deliver His message.

If God can speak through a donkey, He can speak through you. This proves the power is never in the vessel —It is in the One who fills it.

Peter at Pentecost – God speaks through the broken.

Acts 2:14– “But Peter, standing up with the eleven, lifted up his voice...”

This was the same Peter who had denied Christ three times. But when the Holy Spirit filled him, God took his mouth and thousands were saved.

Failure did not disqualify him —God’s filling empowered him.

If God has called you, He will guide your tongue, govern your words, and give you what to say — right when you need it.

You do not speak for God. You speak by God. And when His hand touches your mouth, your weakness becomes His witness.
