Abrahamic Covenant

Three Aspects of the covenant

1. Promise of Land (Gen. 12:1)
 1. Duet. 30:1-10 (If you obey blessing, disobey curses)
2. Promise of Descendants (Gen. 12:2)
 1. 2 Sam. 7:12-16 (Davidic Covenant)
 1. Davidic throne and Messianic kingdom
3. Promise of Blessing an Redemption (Gen. 12:3)
 1. Amplified by Jeremiah 31:31–34; cf. Hebrews 8:6–13
 1. New Covenant, New High Priest
 2. Reaffirmed through Isaac (Genesis 21:12; 26:3–4)
 1. And later Jacob (Genesis 28:14–15).
