Is it worth remaining faithful?

Sermon Questions

Read Rev 19:1-6; Rev 6:9-11

- When justice feels delayed, and faith feels costly, where are you tempted to seek your own vindication instead of trusting that God hears the cries of His faithful servants and will act in His time?

Read Rev 19:7-10; Isa 54:5-8

- Where has God called you to remain faithful in obedience or integrity, trusting that He restores His people without shame, even when faithfulness feels unseen or misunderstood?

Read Rev 19:11-16; Isa 63:1-3

- When truth feels hidden, and power feels dominant, how does seeing Messiah as “Faithful and True”, whose justice is decisive rather than reactive, shape the way you wait for God to act?

Read Rev 19:17-21; Eze 39:17-21

- Where are you tempted to fight for justice, reputation, or control instead of trusting God to dismantle evil and act rightly on your behalf?

What situation in your life do you need to entrust fully to God's justice today so that your response can move from striving to worship?
