(Luke 9:23-25)

Offer your Body as a Living Sacrifice

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God."

(Romans 12:1-2)

The Process

- 1. First Things First You've Got to Have a Desire
- 2. Deny Self
- 3. Take Up Your Cross "Daily"
- 4. Follow Jesus
- 5. Offer Your Body As A Living Sacrifice "...holy and pleasing to God." (Romans 12:1-2)
- 6. Don't Conform to This World
- 7. Be Transformed to change into another form, to transform, to transfigure
 - Christ's appearance was changed and was resplendent with divine brightness on the mount of Transfiguration

- Who Do You Say That Jesus Christ Is?Why is it important to have an accurate view of who Jesus Christ is?
 - To the extent that we know and trust him we will submit to His authority and character.
 - Only when we have a comprehensive and accurate view of His identity—His deity, His holiness, His authority, His distinctiveness—only then are we willing to fully surrender to Him.

The call to surrender is a call to launch into the deep.

- 1. "Put out into deep water and let down your nets for a catch." (Luke 5:4)
- 2. Then they brought the boats to land, left everything, and followed him. (Luke 5:11) "Everything." All their things.

Who are we in Christ?

- 1. Jesus Christ modeled surrender and submission when He obeyed the plan of God, to redeem man.
- 2. Deny. Cross. Lose. Follow.

What is the Essence of Discipleship?

- 1. Deny yourself How do I accomplish this?
 - Take up your cross
- 2. How often must I do this?
 - Daily
- 3. Who is my model?
 - Jesus, follow Me.



What is the Essence of Discipleship?

- 4. What will the result be?
 - Lose your life for My sake, and you will find it.
- **5.** The disciple finds her life in Him, in being "hidden with Christ in God" (Col. 3:3), so that everything of hers—every behavior, every word, every passion, every purpose—takes its surrendered place under the umbrella of imitating Christ and His example.
- 6. Jesus offers to us, His disciples, untold and eternal profit from our unfettered surrender

The Distinguishing Difference Between A Believer and A True Disciple

To Be In, To Be With or To Be Of Christ Galatians 5:24

- A true disciple has chosen the narrow road
- Has Released Control
- Gives unhindered access to every part of your life

The goal is to become a fully formed copy of Jesus Christ by identifying with Him and imitating him in every way and in every aspect of your lives.

The Process of Being His Disciple

- Being a student
- Learning about Him
- Having our minds renewed
- The way we speak
- The way we behave

- The restraint we exhibit
- The humility we exude
- The kindness we share
- The perspective we have
- The choices we make
- The priorities we maintain.

Rewards for being a Disciple that Keeps Christ's Commands

When we keep—that is, observe, remember, and apply—the commands of Jesus Christ, Scripture explains that many rewards will follow.

- 1. God will love us and reveal Himself to us. "He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him" (John 14:21).
- **2. God will dwell with us.** "If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him" (John 14:23).
- 3. We will abide in God's love, and our joy will be full.

"If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full" (John 15:10 –11).

Rewards for being a Disciple that Keeps Christ's Commands

When we keep—that is, observe, remember, and apply—the commands of Jesus Christ, Scripture explains that many rewards will follow.

- **4. We will know that we know and love God.** "And hereby we do know that we know him, if we keep his commandments. . . . Whoso keeps his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know we that we are in him" (I John 2:3, 5). "If ye love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15).
- **5. We will show love to God's children**. "By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God, and keep his commandments" (I John 5:2).
- 6. We will be friends of Christ. "Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you" (John 15:14).



Rewards for being a Disciple that Keeps Christ's Commands

- **7. Our prayers will be answered.** "And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight" (I John 3:22).
- 8. We will be disciples. "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another" (John 13:34–35).
