 - C. The Word of God <u>accomplishes</u> the <u>purposes</u> for which it was <u>sent</u>.
 - D. The <u>promise</u> of God is <u>blessing</u> beyond <u>struggle</u>.

 - A. Everyone who is <u>thirsty</u> is <u>invited</u>!
 - B. You can't <u>buy</u> what I <u>give</u> freely!
 - C. Why buy junk food when you can have steak for free!
 - D. <u>Listen</u> so that your <u>soul</u> may <u>live</u>.
 - E. I will <u>treat</u> you like I <u>treated</u> David!
 - F. I will send you <u>people</u> that you have never <u>heard of</u>.
 - G. The Glory of God will rest on you.
