


Intelligent Design (ID) is Largely Defined by it's Critics

1. ID Is Bad Logic- refuted

But This is Not Intelligent Design...

1. ID is Bad Logic- refuted

Argument from Ignorance

Arguments of this form assume that since something has not been proven false, it is therefore true. Conversely, such an argument may assume that since something has not been proven true, it is therefore false (Steven Downes)

Straw Man Argument

To "attack a straw man" is to create the illusion of having refuted a proposition by replacing it with a superficially similar yet un-equivalent proposition (the "straw man"), and to refute it, without ever having actually refuted the original position (Wiki)

Ironically...

Atheists use this same argument to support their atheism: "There is no proof that God exists, therefore there is no God

Intelligent Design as Defined by it's Proponents







Therefore, empirically we can see that the theory of Intelligent Design looks at evidences and tries to decipher causes rather than starting with Holy Texts and looking for supporting evidences.

We also see that ID is not concerned with answering questions specific to a belief system and ID adherents span a large range of spiritual beliefs and scientific disciplines

3. Design is not Intelligent What is Design?

Noun: **A plan** or drawing produced to show the look and function or workings of a building, garment, or other object **before** it is built or made.

Verb: **Decide** upon the look and functioning of (a building, garment, or other object), typically by making a detailed drawing of it.



ID Does Not Assume a Perfect Design. This is the "Optimal Design" Fallacy



Apparent Design

Design is Actual & Perfect Optimal design means that no further improvement on the design can be implemented or imagined.

Could This Have Been Designed Better?

The 2nd Law of Thermodynamics: The Law of Increasing Entropy (or the Law of continuing decay)

"in all energy exchanges, if no energy enters or leaves the system, the potential energy of the state will always be less than that of the initial state."



The 2nd Law is the scientific understanding of "Sin"

We see that the quality of design has no bearing on the structure in question having been designed. This objection is irrelevant because ID does not speak to the quality of the design but only forethought and purpose.

So then, it must be that Intelligent Design is Unscientific?

What is "Science"

Classical Definition: Science is the search for causes

Colloquial Definition: Science is the implementation of the scientific method, or the following:

- 1. Observation
- 2. Hypotheses
- 3. Test
- 4. Repeat
- 5. Peer Review
- 6. Publish

Philosophical Definition: Science is methodological naturalism (or Atheism). It's a search for natural causes after assuming that there is a natural cause that is findable.

Acceptable Science

1. Stellar Evolution- It's commonly quoted in science textbooks and in scientific literature that stars (like the Sun) evolved through a process similar to Lyells "Nebular Hypothesis" where gas swirls and becomes more and more dense until it becomes a star with a self sustaining (although decaying) heat source.

Problem:

- No one has ever seen a star form or been able to recreate a stars formation in a controlled experiment
- 2. This Theory violates the Conversation Law of Angular Momentum

Acceptable Science


1. Biogenesis: This is the proven theory that life only comes from life. That non-life cannot breed life.

Problem:

1. Evolution by natural selection assumes that life came from "star dust" which evolved into rock which became you and me.


The Main thrust behind the ID Movement is Information Theory. This is that structures that are designed bear the hallmarks of design and these hallmarks are not found in structures that were not designed

2 Kinds of Information:

- Shannon Information- Information that carries no discernable meaning. IE: toss a handful of Leggo's on the floor. What is it?
- 2. Specified Information- Information that has meaning and can be deciphered. IE: assemble the Legg's into a pirate ship. What is it?

ID Searches for...


- 1. Specified Complexity- anything with a less than 1 in 10¹⁵⁰ chance of occurring by (natural) chance
- 2. Irreducible Complexity- a system of parts "wherein the removal of any one of the parts causes the system to effectively cease functioning"




