



Disciple-Making Revolution - Matthew 28:18-20

1. Read Matthew 28:18-20. Why do you think Jesus told the disciples his master plan at the end of his ministry and not at the beginning?
2. As you read this scripture, what do you see about how we are called to obedience, not just church attendance?
3. CCO defines a disciple as someone who is FOLLOWING Jesus, CHANGED by Jesus, and committed to the MISSION of Jesus to make disciples, who make disciples. Discuss this definition with one another.
4. Of the three main tenants of our definition, which one do you struggle with the most? Which one(s) are you succeeding at?
5. If we are going to make disciples like Jesus, we need to look to Jesus and make disciples the way he did. What are some characteristics of how Jesus invested in his 12 disciples? What can we learn about Jesus' methods, and how can we apply them today?
6. In most cases, modern followers of Jesus look at discipleship as information, not transformation. How is the Lord making you more like him? What are some areas that he is working on in you?
7. One key (and mostly overlooked) area of disciple-making is intentional relationships. How are you doing in your intentional Jesus-centered relationship? Where do you need to grow, and where are you doing well? Pray for one another.
