



Galatians: The Faith That Saves – Galatians 2:11-21

Suggested Memory Verse: Galatians 2:20 “I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.”

1. Paul said Peter’s conduct was “not in step with the truth of the gospel” (Galatians 2:14). Where is your conduct currently out of step with what you say you believe?
2. Peter withdrew from the Gentile believers because he feared what others would think. When are you most tempted to let fear of people influence your behavior?
3. Saving faith includes knowing the truth about Jesus, believing it is true, and personally trusting Christ alone. Which of these is easiest for you, and which is hardest?
4. Galatians 2:16 says that no one is justified by works of the law. What religious activity, moral accomplishment, or personal success are you most tempted to rely on for your standing with God?
5. The strength of saving faith comes from its object, not from the intensity of our confidence. How does the frozen lake illustration encourage you when your faith feels weak?
6. Galatians 2:20 says, “It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me.” What label, failure, success, or opinion of others are you allowing to define you more than Christ?
7. What would it look like for you to live by faith in the Son of God this week instead of trying to prove yourself, impress others, or earn God’s approval?
