5. James 1:3 states, "for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness." Steadfastness in Greek implies "a patient frame of mind," leading to less anxiety, anger, fear, and a lower tendency to take offense. What are some other qualities you believe a "patient frame of mind" will cultivate in followers of Jesus?

6. How do trials contribute to maturity in our lives?

7. In our final discussion point this week, we explored the idea that maturity results from persevering rather than giving up. Considering that we've all abandoned a trial that the Lord was leading us through, how can we push through difficulties and avoid seeking the easy way out? Gain inspiration from 2 Corinthians 12:9-10.
