



Galatians: Promise Over Performance – Galatians 3:15-29

Suggested Memory Verse: Galatians 3:26 “For in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.”

1. Galatians 3:15-18 shows that the Law did not cancel the promise God had already made. What area of your life are you most tempted to relate to God like His acceptance depends on how well you are performing?
2. The message contrasted our promises to God with God’s promises to us. What is one promise of God that you need to trust more deeply in your current season?
3. Galatians 3:21-24 teaches that the Law exposes our sin and leads us to Christ. When you become aware of sin or failure in your life, do you tend to run toward Jesus or try to fix yourself first? Why?
4. We often compare ourselves to other people and think, *“I may be bad, but I’m not that bad.”* Where are you most tempted to measure yourself against others instead of God’s standard of holiness?
5. The message said, “The Law says ‘Do.’ The promise says ‘I will.’ The gospel announces ‘Christ has.’” What are you still trying to accomplish for yourself that Christ has already secured for you?
6. Galatians 3:26 says, “for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.” In what area of your life are you still thinking like an employee trying to earn God’s approval rather than a son or daughter who already belongs to Him?
7. Galatians 3:28-29 reminds us that everyone who belongs to Christ stands equally before God. Is there a person or group you are tempted to see as spiritually above or below you? How should the gospel change the way you see them?
