



Integrity in the Pit - Genesis 39–40

1. Genesis 39:2–4 — Joseph’s success came because “the Lord was with him.” What does true success look like when circumstances are hard, and how can we cultivate God’s presence over performance?
2. Genesis 39:7–9 — Joseph resisted temptation by saying, “How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?” How does viewing sin primarily as against God change the way we fight it?
3. Genesis 39:10–12 — Joseph fled from Potiphar’s wife rather than staying to argue. What “garments” might you need to leave behind to walk away from temptation this week?
4. Genesis 39:19–20 — Joseph was punished for doing the right thing. How do you usually respond when obedience leads to pain or misunderstanding?
5. Genesis 39:21–23 — Even in prison, “the Lord was with Joseph.” What practices help you sense God’s presence when life feels unfair or lonely?
6. Genesis 40:6–8 — Joseph noticed the cupbearer and baker’s distress and served them, even while he was still waiting for freedom. How can you serve others in your own “waiting room”?
7. Genesis 40:23 — The cupbearer forgot Joseph, but God did not. When you feel forgotten, what truth from Scripture helps you remember that God still sees and is working?
