Pray Hard Prayers: The Dangerous Prayer - Isaiah 6:1-8

Isaiah 6:8 (ESV): “And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, ‘Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?’ Then I said, ‘Here I am! Send me.’”

1. Isaiah 6:1–4 — Isaiah’s calling begins with a vision of God’s holiness. How does your view of God shape your willingness to obey Him?
2. Isaiah 6:5 — Isaiah responds to God’s holiness with “Woe is me.” What does genuine conviction look like in your life, and how is it different from guilt or shame?
3. Psalm 139:23–24 — David invites God to search him before leading him. Why is self-examination essential before stepping into greater responsibility?
4. Isaiah 6:6–7 — Cleansing comes from the altar before the calling comes from the throne. How does remembering your forgiveness fuel gratitude-driven obedience?
5. Isaiah 6:8 — God asks a question rather than giving a command. What does this reveal about God’s desire for willing surrender rather than forced compliance?
6. Luke 9:23 — Jesus calls His followers to daily surrender. Where might God be asking you for consistent daily obedience rather than a dramatic moment?
7. Romans 12:1 — Presenting your life as a living sacrifice is described as worship. What area of your future feels hardest to place on the altar right now?
