1. Jesus knew the irony of being betrayed with a warm greeting, so He essentially asked Judas, "are you so dead to all feeling that you can kiss and betray?" Judas is a good example of a seared conscience. What is another example of a seared conscience?
2. What is good Bible-teaching able to accomplish in your life? What is good Bible-teaching not able to accomplish?
3. What is being in a home fellowship able to accomplish in your life? What is being in a home fellowship not able to accomplish?
4. What is being in a ministry able to accomplish in your life? What is being in a ministry not able to accomplish?
5. One of Judas's great tragedies is that he had all of the recourses at his disposal to be great but failed to use them. He looked the part from the outside, but we know now he was faking it the whole time. What area of your walk are you most prone to faking? Example: Saying your good when you are not. Going through the motions of prayer but not praying, etc.)
6. Knowing that remorse is not enough, how can we, as believers, do better in being transparent with others? How can we, as believers, do better when someone confesses their sin to us?
7. Knowing that how our life ends is more important than how it begins, how are you going to fight the good fight of faith so that you will hear "well done"?
