2. Do you have the gift of faith?

1. Do you view obstacles as opportunities to trust God for the impossible?
2. Do you find yourself frequently boasting about the power of God and what you've seen him do?
3. Do you find other Christians coming to you when they face a seemingly overwhelming trial or task?
4. When you hear people say, I just don't see how it could happen, you are secretly asking God to show them how powerful he is?
5. Do you get overwhelming joy and satisfaction when God comes through when everyone else thought it was a lost cause.

3. Have you seen anyone supernaturally healed? Share the story. Have you ever seen someone healed and the world/doctors claimed it as a medical miracle? Why is the world so quick to dismiss supernatural healing? How is healing encourage the Church?

4. Do you have the gift of healing?

1. Do you have a deep compassion for people who are sick?
2. Do you have a deep conviction that God can heal anybody?
3. Do you enjoy praying for people who are sick?
4. Do you have a desire to go to hospitals, clinic's, or anywhere there are sick people and pray for them?

5. Of all the gifts, miracles are the least common as the nature of the word suggest, they are rare and uncommon. Do you find yourself skeptical about these gifts (healings, miracles)? If you are skeptical, do you find yourself basing your doctrine/theology on experience or on the Word of God? How do we work to align ourselves with biblical doctrine rather than experience?
