

A Test of Wills Luke 22:35-46

1. Read Luke 22:35. Jesus here is reminding his disciples that he will provide all of their needs. Why do we need to be reminded of this as well? How does knowing that he will provide for our needs help us serve him and his people better?

2. In Luke 22:36, at first glance, it looks like Jesus is telling his followers to get ready for a physical battle but then in v.51 tells Peter to put away his sword. Jesus, in this case, is telling his followers that the time is coming when he will not be with them physically, and they must be prepared for the battle without him physically at their side. With this in mind, read and discuss 2 Corinthians 10:4.

3. What is your biggest hindrance to prayer? How can you overcome it?

4. How can we become more aware of our total need for the Lord in every situation?

5. Satan will often use the things of this world to distract us and lull us to sleep. What are some things that Satan uses to distract you and pull you away from being fully awake in Christ?

6. Some might say that it is a cop-out to pray, "Your will be done." Agree/Disagree? Why?

7. Take some time to pray for the Father's will in your life, the life of your family, and the life of your church family.
