



Galatians: No Other Gospel – Galatians 1:1-10

Memory Verse: Galatians 1:10 “For am I now seeking the approval of man, or of God? Or am I trying to please man? If I were still trying to please man, I would not be a servant of Christ.”

1. Paul was astonished that the Galatians had so quickly turned to a “different gospel.” Why do you think it is so easy for us to drift away from the simplicity of trusting in Christ alone?
2. Pastor Dan shared several modern examples of adding something to the gospel (church activity, moral performance, politics, traditions, experiences, financial status, etc.). Which one do you find yourself most tempted to add to Jesus, and why?
3. Have you ever found yourself believing that God loved or accepted you more because you were “doing well” spiritually? What helped you recognize the difference between earning God’s acceptance and living from God’s acceptance?
4. Paul asks, “Am I now seeking the approval of man, or of God?” (Galatians 1:10). Whose approval do you find yourself chasing most often, and how does that affect your relationship with Christ?
5. Pastor Dan said, “Whatever comes after the word ‘plus’ has become a functional savior.” If you honestly filled in the blank, “Jesus + _____,” what would your answer reveal about where your confidence really rests?
6. Grace doesn’t eliminate holiness; it produces it. What does it look like to pursue obedience because you are already accepted by Christ rather than trying to earn His acceptance?
7. After hearing this message, what is one practical way you can remind yourself this week that your righteousness is found in Christ alone?
