



Exodus 30:22-29(NIV)

Then the Lord said to Moses, 23 "Take the following fine spices: 500 shekels of liquid myrrh, half as much (that is, 250 shekels) of fragrant cinnamon, 250 shekels of fragrant calamus, ²⁴ 500 shekels of cassia—all according to the sanctuary shekel—and a hin of olive oil. ²⁵ Make these into a sacred anointing oil, a fragrant blend, the work of a perfumer. It will be the sacred anointing oil. ²⁶ Then use it to anoint the tent of meeting, the ark of the covenant law, ²⁷ the table and all its articles, the lampstand and its accessories, the altar of incense, ²⁸ the altar of burnt offering and all its utensils, and the basin with its stand. 29 You shall consecrate them so they will be most holy, and whatever touches them will be holy.



There's a danger in learning how to do church without having the oil of the Holy Spirit on your life.





2. A Consecration Anointing

God's anointing on your life is not between you and the world, it's between you and God.



Nyrrh smells sweet but is bitter in taste.

If you're truly anointed, you'll go through some suffering.

You cannot measure how God feels about you by if you suffer.

Myrrh is an ingredient that reminds us that the anointed life is one of <u>SELFLESSNESS</u> and <u>SURRENDER</u> to the call of God.

2. Cinnamon

Coppicing = cutting down a tree in order for it to regrow and reproduce.

Cinnamon Reminds us: 1. There's pain involved in life.

2. Posture matters to God.

Ephesians 5:15-16(NKIV) See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, ¹⁶ redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

To Live Circumspectly: to keep your eyes peeled and be very cautious and judicious in your decision making; understanding that there are ramifications for every decision that you make.

Cinnamon reminds us to live upright and holy lives.
