Compassion or kindness shown toward someone whom you have the right or power to punish:

Mercy is given by someone who has the power to punish or forgive. If God only gave us what we deserve we wouldn't get very much would we? But the thing that still amazes me is that God wants to love me when I think I am unlovable.

He wants to forgive me when I think I am unforgivable.

He wants to show me mercy when I think I deserve to be punished.

We get rewarded when we do nothing to earn it.

We get salvation even though we didn't earn it.
