³⁸As he taught, Jesus said, "<u>Watch out for the teachers of the law</u>. <u>They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces</u>, ³⁹and have the <u>most important seats in the synagogues</u> and the <u>places of honor at banquets</u>. ⁴⁰They <u>devour widows' houses</u> and for a show <u>make lengthy prayers</u>. These men will be punished most severely."

⁴¹Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts.

⁴²But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.

⁴³Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. ⁴⁴They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."
