

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

October is here, and it brings with it the beauties of autumn—crisp mornings, the vibrant colors of the changing leaves, and settling into the rhythm of regular schedules.

In our church, October also brings the start of a new church year with the rotation of Deacons, other leadership positions, committees, and teams, as well as the start of a new budget year. Our Deacons have chosen officers for the new year. Sarah Davis will serve as chair of Deacons, Debbie Hill will serve again as Vice-chair, and Bardin Torres will continue as secretary. Our new budget goes into effect on October 1, and on behalf of our staff, let me say a heart-felt and hearty "Thank You!" for the generous salary adjustments you approved as a congregation. A new year of work starts for our committees in October. What's left is the formation of our various ministry teams to carry out the many areas of ministry activities in our church.

You can see elsewhere in this edition of *The Messenger* the details about our Ministry Fair that will take place on Sunday, October 19. We'll have a fellowship lunch for everyone (church members and their families, regular attendees, and others joining us for worship that day). After the lunch, we request that you visit the various tables where there will be sign-up sheets for the different ministries of our church. Please approach this very prayerfully, asking God sincerely how and where he wants you to be involved in the life, ministry, and mission of MBC. You do not have to be an "official member" to sign up for a ministry team; if God is placing one of these areas on your heart, we welcome you to be a part of that ministry or those ministries!

Remember that while the Pastor and staff serve important functions in the pastoral, music, youth, and administrative ministries of our church, and our Deacons in their elected roles take on many responsibilities, they can't do it all. As Baptist Christians, we profess a strong belief in the *priesthood of all believers*. This priesthood not only means the privilege of direct access to God through Christ; it also means



the responsibility to serve Christ, one another, and the community around us in his name! *Every believer* is to serve in the ministry and mission of Christ's church!

I encourage you to be here, and to sign up prayerfully as God leads you. You may be saying, "I've done my part" or "I just can't do what I used to do." That may be true. But you can still be involved through prayer, through being an encourager, or by serving in a less demanding role. Ask God to guide you, consider the opportunities to serve, and respond as God leads you.

On another note, October also brings an important milestone with it—the second anniversary of our ministry together as Pastor and People. I have long been a reflective person. It's important to me to look back and reflect on how God has been working, what he has been doing, and how he has been forming me and those around me through what he has been and is doing.

From the beginning of our time together, you have made JoAnn and me feel like part of the MBC family. You welcomed us into the church and into your lives, and we are grateful. You've given me a special gift in this last season of my fulltime ministry, allowing me to be the kind of pastor God made me and called me to be—a shepherd caring for the flock of God under the direction of the Great and Good Shepherd, focusing on the word of the Lord and the welfare of his people. I've told several of my minister friends that if I could have chosen the kind of church I wanted to serve as my last full-time assignment, MBC is about as close as you could get.

The Lord is working among us. And for that I say, Thanks be to God! And thank you for another wonderful year together! We love you all and look forward to the coming years.


