

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

Each year we choose four people to serve as deacons for a three-year term, so that we have twelve deacons serving at any given time. This is an important decision we should always approach carefully and prayerfully. This year's election is on Sunday, September 21.

As we prepare to choose deacons, it's important that we consider what the Bible teaches us about the kind of persons we should choose to serve. Paul provides us with the biblical standard in 1 Timothy 3:8-13 (NIV®), where he gave Timothy instructions on the qualifications of deacons. He describes the character qualifications of deacons using terms such as "worthy of respect" and "sincere" (literally, "not doubletongued") - or as we might put it, "not talking out of both sides of their mouths." He says they should not indulge in "much wine" nor pursue "dishonest gain." This was extremely important, since in the early church the deacons often made the actual distribution of funds to the needy. They must be sound in their faith, and have proven themselves in their lifestyle and involvement in ministry to persons in need. He adds that women serving as deacons (v. 11 is literally "Women, likewise . . . "; compare Phoebe, a deacon of the church in Cenchreae, in Romans 16:1; RSV, NRSV, NIV® 2011, NASB footnote) must have the same characteristics, and not be gossipers, but rather temperate and trustworthy in everything. In addition to all this, Paul emphasizes that deacons must faithful in their family relationships, as "one-woman men" and fathers who manage their children and households well.

To summarize, Paul says that deacons must be persons of genuine faith, individuals whose lifestyles demonstrate Christian character, who are tried and proven in their character and service. They must have the attitude of a servant—that's what the title means! Like the pastor ("overseer" or "bishop" in 1 Timothy 3), deacons should model the Christian walk for the congregation as trustworthy, solid, stable servants of the Lord, willing to serve his church!

As we elect deacons for the coming year, prayerfully consider



the names that will be presented in light of these biblical qualifications, and seek God's guidance as you vote.

On another subject, as we shared in a church conference some time ago, the West Chowan Baptist Association has chosen to end its relationship this October with any churches that are affiliated in any way with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. Since early this year, the pastors and other representatives from four area churches affected by this decision have met multiple times with CBFNC leaders to explore how we might move forward together. We are actively pursuing the idea of forming a regional fellowship composed of CBF-related churches in the broader northeastern North Carolina region and possibly even the southeastern Virginia region.

As a first step in this process, there will be a Northeastern NC Regional Gathering at First Baptist Church, Ahoskie on Sunday, September 28, beginning at 3:45 p.m. and lasting until around 7:30 p.m. Registration will begin at 3:45. There will be an opening welcome session at 4:00, followed at 4:15 by breakout learning sessions about CBF (an overview), CBF Global Missions, Deacons as Spiritual Leaders, and Rebranding Jesus-Centered Engagement. We'll share food and fellowship around the table at 5:15, then join in worship at 6:30, with Marc and Kim Wyatt, a former and a current CBF Field Personnel as the main speakers. By the way, the Wyatts will also be with us and speak in our worship service that morning.

This gathering is for all the members of our churches, and especially our leaders. I hope you'll plan to participate! If you plan to be there for the meal, you'll need to register online at cbfnc.org. Scroll down and click on the Northeastern NC Regional Gathering button to go to the registration page. The cost of the meal is \$10. If you need help registering, contact the church office and we will assist you. I hope we'll have strong representation from MBC!

Please be praying for this effort. It holds great promise for future fellowship and cooperation in mission efforts in our region.
