### Been There—6 When They Take You for Granted

As [Jesus] entered a village there, ten men with leprosy stood at a distance, <sup>13</sup>crying out, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" Luke 17:12-13 NLT

[Jesus] looked at them and said, "Go show yourselves to the priests." <u>And as they went</u>, <u>they were cleansed of</u> <u>their leprosy</u>. <sup>15</sup><u>One of them</u>, when he saw that he was healed, came back to Jesus, shouting, "Praise God!" <sup>16</sup>He fell to the ground at Jesus' feet, thanking him for what he had done. # 2. Those you serve the most, often appreciate you the least.

"And please remember me and do me a favor when things go well for you. Mention me to Pharaoh, so he might let me out of this place. <sup>15</sup>For I was kidnapped from my homeland, the land of the Hebrews, and now I'm here in prison, but I did nothing to deserve it."

"Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven. <sup>2</sup>So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the

hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. ... <sup>4</sup>Then your Father, <u>who sees what</u> <u>is done in secret</u>, will reward you." Matthew 6:1-2, 4 NIV
