What we call God's disturbing interruptions are often God's divine invitations.

Confused and disturbed, Mary tried to think what the angel could mean. Luke 1:29 NLT

You don't have to understand the plan to trust that God has a purpose.

"Don't be afraid, Mary," the angel told her, "for you have found favor with God!" Luke 1:30 NLT

Favor is the undeserved blessings God lavishly pours out on His children.

"You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be very great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³And he will reign over Israel forever; his Kingdom will never end!" Luke 1:31-33 NLT

Sometimes God's favor doesn't seem favorable ... at first.

Mary asked the angel, "But how can this happen? I am a virgin." Luke 1:34 NLT

And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. ... For nothing will be impossible with God." Luke 1:35, 37 ESV
