Don't forget that you Gentiles used to be outsiders. ... ¹²In those days you were living apart from Christ. ... You lived in this world without God and without hope. ¹³But now you have been united with Christ Jesus. Once you were far away from God, but now you have been brought near to him through the blood of Christ. ... ¹⁹So now you Gentiles are no longer strangers and foreigners. You are citizens along with all of God's holy people. You are members of God's family. Ephesians 2:11-13, 19 NLT
