Icebreaker:

Share about a time when you were challenged or faced opposition for standing up for something you believed in. How did you respond?

Opening Prayer

Invite someone to open with a prayer asking God for boldness and clarity in discussion.

Bible Reading

Acts 4:1-13

Discussion Questions:

1 - Custody (Acts 4:1-4) – Facing Opposition

What stood out to you about the arrest of Peter and John?

Even though Peter and John were arrested, the number of believers grew to about 5,000 men. What does this teach us about God's work in the midst of opposition?

How do you typically respond when your faith is questioned or challenged? What might it look like to trust God in those moments like Peter and John did?

2 - Conviction (Acts 4:5-12) – Boldness Through the Spirit

What does Peter's boldness teach us about speaking truth when it's uncomfortable or intimidating?

How have you experienced the Holy Spirit giving you boldness in a situation where you felt unprepared or scared?

Acts 4:12 says there is salvation in no one else but Jesus. How does this exclusivity challenge you in your daily life and interactions?

What's the difference between being "exclusive" in truth but "inclusive" in invitation, and how can we live that out today?

3 - Calling (Acts 4:13) – Being With Jesus

The council recognized Peter and John had been with Jesus. Why is personal time with Jesus foundational to boldness and effective witness?

What practical ways can you "be with Jesus" more consistently in your everyday life?

How does your closeness to Jesus influence the way you respond to challenges, opposition, or fear?
