Overview

- The Christian life involves <u>challenge</u> <u>and</u> <u>conflict</u> whether we like it or not
- The world, the flesh, and the devil are united against Christ and His people
 - Ephesians 2:1-3
- A main theme of the Bible is God's holy warfare against <u>Satan</u> and <u>sin</u>
 - Genesis 3:15; Revelations 19:11-21; Colossians 2:13-15
- If we ignore the <u>spiritual</u> battle, we lose the victory

Joshua 6

- Tells the story of an obstacle JERICHO
 - The decision to be made (to continue or to run away)
 - Israel's victory at Jericho illustrates principles of spiritual conflict and victory that we can use
- Responses to crossroads
 - We plan and hope to succeed
 - We plan and ask God to bless it
 - We ask God to plan, then we do what He tells us to do <-(Godly response)
 - Option 3 is the pray and obey

Overcoming Obstacles

- Communication (vv1-2)
 - Joshua spoke to God and God spoke to Joshua

- God provides strength, comfort, and hope
- Let communicating with God be your <u>first</u> plan of attack, not your <u>last</u> resort
- Compliance (vv6-7)
 - Joshua complied with the plan of God
 - Joshua transitioned from just talking to action
 - God used Joshua because he had faith and he would obey
- Confidence (vv20-21)
 - Rams horn in Hebrew is jubilee
 - Biblical numerology, 7 represents completeness or perfection and comes from the root word meaning to be full or satisfied
 - God will finish what He started

Joshua's Instructions

- Devote the entire city to God (vv17-19)
- Rescue Rahab and her family (v26)
- Destroy the people (v21)
- Burn the city (v24)
- After the <u>victory</u>, give God the <u>glory</u> (Hebrews 11:30)

It takes a journey of faith to overcome obstacles!
