See how Jesus handled the "AND"

Luke 7:13 (NKJV)

When the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep."

Matthew 14:14 (NKJV)

And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick.

Matthew 20:34 (NKJV)

So Jesus had compassion and touched their eyes. And immediately their eyes received sight, and they followed Him.

Mark 6:34 (KJV)

And Jesus, when he came out, saw much people, and was moved with

compassion toward them, because they were as sheep not having a shepherd: and he began to teach them many things.

Matthew 18:27 (HCSB)

Then the master of that slave had compassion, released him, and forgave him the loan.

Compassion

Compassion moved Jesus to action

John 13:35 (NLT)

Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.

When love like that drives you to action (as it did Jesus), it will prove to the world that you belong to Him!

With Jesus, compassion always led Him to an action (there's always the "and").

Compassion and sympathy are not the same. Sympathy means you feel for them, compassion means you feel with them.

- Sympathy at its root is about you.
- Compassion at its root is about others.

The test of compassion is in the "and"...

He goes on to say, "Feelings of compassion are God's call to action! The way you know whether you choose compassion isn't by how you feel but by what you do. The test of compassion isn't the feelings you have but the one at a time stories you can tell."

Psalms 116:5 (NIV)

The Lord is gracious and righteous; our God is full of compassion.

2 Corinthians 1:3-4 (NIV)

Praise be to God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

Paul goes on to say, not only does God fill you with comfort... you can't hold all of it! It overflows! It's not our comfort, it's His comfort in us that flows through us!

Have you allowed God to comfort and work in you? It's always "in then through" – He has to work in you in order to work through you. Let Him start – today!
