## **God Wants Your Heart**

- God wants your heart, not your PERFORMANCE

### ***Psalm 51:16-17 (MSG)***

Going through the motions doesn't please you, a flawless performance is nothing to you. I learned God-worship when my pride was shattered. Heart-shattered lives ready for love don't for a

moment escape God's notice.

- God wants your heart, not your RELIGION

### ***Hosea 6:6 (NLT)***

I want you to show love, not offer sacrifices. I want you to know Me more than I want burnt offerings.

*God doesn't want more religion; He wants more of you!*
