

Week 1: Endure With Hope

Reading

In this sermon, Pastor Daniel shares 3 delightful benefits of the Christian life that helps us endure today's world. They are derived from Sunday's passage in 1 Peter 1:1-6:

Read 1 Peter 1:1-6

Before you dive into the text, begin with prayer. Invite God to show you *truths* from the text and *disciplines* you can practice. Take your time through the Scriptures. Read them slowly, thoughtfully, humbly, prayerfully, and practically.

If you are new to reading the Bible, we recommend choosing a version like the New International Version (NIV) or New Living Translation (NLT). We also recommend the YouVersion Bible reading app.

Go ahead and read 1 Peter 1:1-6.

Reflection & Discussion:

"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." – 2 Timothy 3:16

What type of posture should we have in such interactions? (See 1 Peter 3:15 for help)

From 1 Peter 1:2, what is unique about the connection between "sanctification of the Spirit" and "for obedience to Jesus Christ?"
