Criteria we use to examine our effectiveness.

Signpost 1:

We must value a <u>religionless</u> <u>Christianity</u>.

"Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light." Matthew 11:28-30; see also Matthew 24:14

Christianity is the constant releasing of burdens.

Religion vs. Gospel

We must value a family of we care.



Signpost 4:

We must value leadership growth.

"Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety." Proverbs 11:14

"Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them-not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve." 1 Peter 5:2

"Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock... to care for the church of God..." Acts 20:28

"Leading an organization is as much about souls as it is systems." - *Five Levels of Leadership*

There are three things I do:

- 1) Teach the Bible
- 2) Guide our culture
- 3) Develop the staff
 - A. Their own soul care
 - B. Their community leadership

Life group leaders and team leaders are essential to this value.

Plumb Line:

Leadership is key to caring well.

Signpost 5:

We must value Bible-centered Teaching.

"They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people understood what was being read." Nehemiah 8:8,

"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16-17

"For the word of God is living and active... piercing to the division of soul and of spirit... discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." Hebrews 4:12

Reading the Bible is a divine experience.

How we will teach:

Teaching rhythms will revolve around *seasons* and *series*. What is God saying in this season?

Variety of sermon series:

- Expository books of the Bible, like James or Esther
- <u>Topical</u> felt needs, like anxiety, relationships or apologetics.
- <u>Doctrine</u> the virgin birth, spiritual gifts, the Trinity, etc.

Sunday teaching is intended for *sermon-based life groups*. As part of soul care and we care.

(Specialty groups are allowed)

Plumb Line:

The divine life flows from the Living Word.

Signpost 6:

We must value <u>Spirit-Filled</u> Living.

"In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams." Acts 2:17 (spiritual power and spiritual gifts)

"Where the spirit of the Lord is there is freedom... We all... are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit." 2 Corinthians 3:6-18... " (character formation)

Leader of the Azusa Street Revival said,

"The primary evidence of the Holy Spirit is divine love... If you get angry, or speak evil, or backbite, I care not how many tongues you may have, you have not the baptism with he Holy Spirit. Pentecost makes us love Jesus more and love our brothers more. It brings us all into one common family... when you sum it up, it's just more of God's love." - William Seymour

"God did not give us a **spirit** of fear, but of **power**, **love**, and a **sound mind.**" 2 Tim 1:7

Plumb Line:

The Spirit is evidenced three ways: character formation, spiritual power and love.

Signpost 7:

We must value a passion for community care.

"A demonstration of the Spirit is given to each person for the common good." 1 Corinthians 12:7

"Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice... to set the oppressed free...? Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter...?" Isaiah 58:6-7, Ps. 89:14, Matt 23:23,

Compassion + justice = peace | See Jeremiah 29:7

Plumb Line:

True love has the backbone of justice.

Signpost 8:

We must value <u>engagement</u> in the <u>Great</u> <u>Commission</u>.

90% of our social connection happens online.

Two types of people we engage:

- People of the faith
- People not of the faith

5 Levels of Spirituality

- Not intersted
- Spiritually curious
- Believer
- Growing in Christ
- Helping others grow in Christ

People engage 15 times online before they visit in person. *The internet* is the new front doors, *life groups* are the back doors.

No more growth track-next steps are organic to each person. Whether you're a seeker or seasoned, you have a next step.

Purpose

Four Things We Do:

1. Know Jesus Through Interactive Friendship

We believe our relationship with Jesus is one of interactive friendship which yields the miraculous result of human transformation. Learning to live intimately with him is foundational to spiritual formation.

2. <u>Pursue Health</u> In a Rhythm of Life

We believe following Jesus is the journey of healthy spirituality for our souls and for the sake of others. A "Rhythm of Life" is a personal plan of how we create space in our lives to cultivate these "four things we do."

3. Choose Community In Life Groups

We choose community outside of the weekend service because this is how we live as Christ's church. Life groups are a safe place where the masks can come off, where we enjoy life-giving friendships, grow to become like Christ and follow him.

4. **Show Jesus** Through Prayer, Care, & Share

Alongside of joining available care opportunities, we encourage our groups and members to develop a prayer, care and share lifestyle. We pray for our friends and neighbors, show care for them, and share our faith.
