- 1. Describe a time when you were young, and you wanted something but were completely dependent on someone else to make it possible.
- 2. Described a time when you wanted something, some "what," very much, but then were disappointed once you got it or lost interest in it quickly. Explain why "hope is <u>not</u> a what."
- 3. **Read Romans 5:1-5.** What does it mean that we have been "justified" by faith in Jesus? What are the implications of our justification?
- 4. Why is it so good to know that we "stand" in God's grace?
- 5. **Read Romans 5:3.** Explain how suffering produces endurance and endurance character. What does it mean to have character the way Paul is talking about in this verse?
- 6. How does the endurance and character suffering produces in people of faith lead them to hope? What does this have to do with celebrating Christmas?
- 7. How does the Holy Spirit help us know our hope in Jesus will not put us to shame?
- 8. **Read 1 John 3:1.** What is the connection between being a child of God and having hope in Jesus?
- 9. What specific things can you do this Advent season to focus on and celebrate the truth that Jesus' birth means there is true hope for God's children?
