# List some reasons people participate in a local church like CCCC?

- o Why did you start coming to CCCC in the beginning?
- o Has your motivation for engaging in the church changed? If so, how?
- $_{\odot}$  Revelation 20 includes "visions" from the past (v. 1-3), the present (v. 4-6), and the future (v. 7-15) that motivate us to be on mission.

### Read Revelation 20:1-3

- According to the text, what does John explicitly say Satan is bound from doing?
- What does Matthew 12:28-29 and Luke 10:17-18 tell us about when Satan is bound?
- o How do verses 1-3 motivate us to be on mission?

#### Read Revelation 20:4-6

- o Where do the events of this passage take place?
- o Who are the people on the thrones?
- According to 4b-6, why does John introduce us to these people? What does this say about followers of Jesus who die?
- o How do verses 4-6 motivate us to be on mission?

# • Read Revelation 20:11-15

- o When do the events of this passage take place?
- Why is the book called "the Lamb's book of life" (Rev 13:8)
- o How do the books and the book portray the gospel?
- o How do verses 11-15 motivate us to be on mission?

- What is the church loosed to do according to Matthew 28:18-20?
- How do you participate in making disciples who make disciples?
- Which of the motivations to be on mission which are listed in this passage are most compelling to you? (Satan is bound, the church is loosed to make disciples, judgment is coming) Why?
- Which of the gospel identities (citizen, family, missionary) does Rev. 20 highlight? How can we encourage each other to make disciples who make disciples?
