• Do you think Americans have increasingly become more individualistic over the years? Can you give examples?

- What are the positives of a strong individualism?
- o What are the negatives of a strong individualism?

Read Acts 2:41-42

- How does this passage describe the gathering of the early Christians?
- o What stands out to you about this passage?
- What are generally known as the spiritual disciplines of the faith?
 - How does the passage emphasis the plurality of doing the spiritual disciplines?
 - Where does Bible study fall into this passage?

Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17

- o Put this passage into your own words?
- Why would this suggest that the reading and study of Scripture is essential to spiritual growth?

• Did anyone grow up hearing about studying the Bible by yourself (devotionally; quiet time)?

- o What are the benefits of studying the Scripture by yourself?
- The statement was made that the Bible isn't primarily addressed to us as individuals but to the believing covenant community as a whole.
 - o Why is this an important truth?
 - o How can we find examples of that in the New Testament?
 - o The sermon stressed that the vast majority of "you" references in the Bible are plural (i.e., y'all), not singular. Why does that matter?
