- 1. **Read Amos 2:6-12.** What are the charges brought against Israel?
- 2. Why does God bring up their history of being rescued out of Egypt?
- 3. What is significant about Israel commanding the prophets not to prophesy?
- 4. **Read Exodus 22:21-24.** What stands out to you about how God commands Israel to treat the vulnerable and marginalized?
- 5. **Read Amos 4:6-13.** What response was God looking for from Israel when they faced challenging circumstances? How did Israel respond?
- 6. Looking back on your life, what are some circumstances—both good and bad—that God has used to draw you to himself?
- 7. **Read Amos 5:21-24.** What does this teach us about true worship? How does this challenge your view of worship?
- 8. What passages in the New Testament does this remind you of? (Look at Matthew 7:21-23; 23:23; 25:31-46; James 1:27; Colossians 3)
- 9. Read Amos 9:8-12. What judgment awaits Israel?
- 10. What does Amos mean by "the booth of David"? How do we see this prophecy fulfilled in the coming of Jesus?
- 11. How does Amos challenge you to pursue justice in our society? Has this challenged you to confess any sin? Has this challenged you to do something different in your life?
