#### • Ice Breakers:

 Making friends as an adult can be difficult. Describe how you made friends when you were a kid versus the challenge of making friends as an adult.

## Jesus as a Good Friend

- Consider the life of Jesus and how he made friends. How did Jesus forge friendships with...
  - The 12 disciples?
  - With his inner circle of 3 (Peter, James, John)?
  - Sinners (Matthew 11:19)?
  - The group of women who followed him?
  - The 70 he sent out?

#### • Read John 15:12-17

- How does Jesus describe friendship in this text?
  - Is he only talking to the 12 disciples or are we included as a friend of God? (Notice how Jesus establishes the friendship in v 13 & 15)
  - What characteristics in those two verses reveal Jesus as an unusually good friend?
- What command is most often repeated in this text?
- How does Jesus tell us we forge friendships? (v 12-13)
  - Love like Christ loved us
  - Lay down your lives for your friends

# • Jesus calls you a friend.... And then calls you to be a friend.

- o How can we love our friends like Jesus loved us?
- How can we lay down our lives for our friends like Jesus laid down his life for you?

### • Take the Initiative

- What verse in John 15 shows that Jesus took the initiative in establishing friendship first? (Also see 1 John 4:19)
- What does it look like for you to take the initiative in your friendships?

### • Sacrifice for your friends

- o Are you known as a generous friend?
  - With your time?
  - With your resources?
- How can create margin for both planned and unplanned time with your friends?

### Commit to Life in Community

- Jesus was committed to life in community (70/12/3). Are you committed to the same?
- o What does it look like to have a village?
- o What role does small group play in your commitment to community?
