Haggai: The Satisfying Love of God

For the Love of God Series Discussion Questions

- 1. What did life look like for you five months ago? What do you miss most about pre-COVID life?
- 2. The book of Haggai takes place in a short five month window, and is only 38 verses long. Take time to read the book of Haggai out loud as a group. (this will take less than 10 minutes)
- 3. In Haggai 1:2-6
 - a. What does God accuse Israel of?
 - b. What command does Haggai give them? (verse 5)
- 4. How can you relate to Israel when it comes to their priorities?
- 5. How have you felt dissatisfied, discontent, or frustrated in this season?
- 6. What does it look like to "consider your ways"? (Notice the repetition of that command throughout Haggai)
- 7. In **Haggai 1:12-15**, when Israel obeyed the voice of the Lord, what happened as a result?
 - a. How did they experience God's presence?
 - b. How did it unify them as a people?
 - c. What was the result of their unity in Spirit?
- Talk about an experience you've had where you: LISTEN & OBEY GOD → EXPERIENCE HIS PRESENCE → UNIFIED IN SPIRIT → UNIFIED ACTION
- 9. Read **Matthew 6:31-33**. How does Jesus command relate to what we learn in Haggai?
- 10. What does it practically look like for us to seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness?

- 11. The word REPENT is similar to the command in Haggai to CONSIDER YOUR WAYS. Are there things in your life you need to REPENT of, in order to seek first the Kingdom of God?
 - a. Celebrate how you've seen God move in the last 5 months.
 - b. Commit to one thing this week that will help you seek first the Kingdom of God.
