DISCUSSION GUIDE

START:

- What was the best team you were ever a part of? What was your role/position on it? Why did you like that team?

THINK:

- Take a look at Nehemiah chapter 3:3-6. Each of the names or groups mentioned actually represents a team. This continues throughout the whole chapter. How many teams do you think are mentioned in the whole chapter? (Ask around the group. Answer: approx. 43)
- Nehemiah's mission was to re-build the walls of Jerusalem. It obviously meant a lot to the people and teams he gathered. TCC's mission is to reach more people and change more lives. What does that mission mean to you?
- Nehemiah had 43 teams build the walls together, how many teams do you think your campus of TCC needs to have working together in order to thrive? (anywhere from 44-13)
- Where do you think you can fit into the mission on your campus? If you don't know, how do you think you can find out?

PRAY:

- No matter where you are on your journey of faith, ask God to make it clear to you where and how you can fit into the mission of TCC.

ACT:

- If you are already serving in or leading a serve group at your campus, ask at least 1 person who isn't yet on a team to join you & try it out.
- If you are not yet part of a team, go to the Guest Center on your campus and learn about getting connected.

READ:

The Fish Gate was rebuilt by the sons of Hassenaah. They laid its beams and put its doors and bolts and bars in place.

Meremoth son of Uriah, the son of Hakkoz, repaired the next section. Next to him Meshullam son of Berehiah, the son of Meshezabel, made repairs, and next to him Zadok son of Baana also made repairs.

The next section was repaired by the men of Tekoa, but their nobles would not put their shoulders to the work under their supervisors.^[a]

The Jeshanah^[b] Gate was repaired by Joiada son of Paseah and Meshullam son of Besodeiah. They laid its beams and put its doors with their bolts and bars in place.
