**Title**: The Great "I AM" Who Reveals & Speaks To Us

Main Text: Exodus 3:2-15

**Supporting Texts**: 2 Timothy 3:16-17, 1 Corinthians 14:37-38, 2 Peter 1:16-21, Luke

16:27-31

**Main Point:** God's name is YHWH "I AM WHO I AM" and this God has made Himself knowable, and desires to be in relationship with us, & thus He speaks to us.

**Main Questions Addressed**: What does God mean by His Name "I AM WHO I AM"? How does God speak to us/How can I hear from God?

God's, YHWH "Yahweh", name speaks of Himself as: Self-Existent/Self-Sufficient, Unchanging, Relational, Eternal.

It is the covenant name of God to the people of Israel

\*Because God is a relational God He reveals Himself to us and speaks to us just as He has to Moses.

So how can I hear God's voice? How does He speak to us?

- 1.) God speaks primarily through His Word & secondarily however He chooses
  - Can God speak audibly to us? A:Yes
  - o Can God speak through dreams, vision, & other miraculous means? A:Yes
  - But God always speaks through His Word
- 2.) You **do not need** a voice or miracle to hear from God

Paul talks about the nature of Scripture in 2 Timothy 3:16-17

Paul talks about the authority of "what he has written" as God's own commands

- 2 Corinthians 14:37-38
  - If what you think you hear from God contradicts what is written in His Word, you are deceived.

Peter agrees with Paul and teaches that Scripture is superior to experience.

Scripture > Experience, because Scripture is more certain and more sure.

2 Peter:16-21

- 3.) God's Word is permanent, unchanging, complete, & more authoritative than an experience
- 4.) You do not need an audible voice to know what God has and is speaking
- 5.) Do not be like the Jews who were always seeking a "sign", because you are unwilling to read, trust, and obey what God has already said in His Word.

Luke 16:27-31

**Closing Recap**: God's name is YHWH and He is Self-existent, Unchanging, Relational, & Eternal and this God speaks to Us primarily through His Word and secondarily, through other means.
