B. A Survey of His Friends

- 1. Accuse (4-14)
- a. Eliphaz- no innocent person ever perishes
- b. Bildad- Your children were penalized for their sin
- c. Zophar- Don't you know God has even forgotten some of your sin?
 - d. Job says, prove it!

2. Condemn (15-21)

a. Eliphaz- Your denial is hindering your relationship

b. Bildad- Your actions are those of one who knows not God

c. Zophar- This is what happens to wicked people

- 3. Castigate-reprimand severely (22-28)
 - a. Eliphaz- Your wickedness is great and sins endless
- b. Bildad- There's no way you can be right...you had to do something, after all you're a man Job
 - c. Zophar- Is done with the situation
- d. Job- If I could find Him, I'd plead my case, but however, I'll come forth as pure gold!

4. Admonish (Elihu) (32-37)

a. He is young but wise and moves the argument of the book

b. Condemns Retribution theology and the other three

- c. Rebukes Job for maintaining innocence and insinuating fault with God
 - d. He prepares us for God's speech

C. God Speaks (38-42)

- 1. God bombards Job with over 70 questions, of which he is unable to answer any (38)
- 2. Job admits to being small potatoes in the grand scheme of things (40:4) and has spoken out of turn

D. His Finish (42)

1. He confesses God's Sovereignty (42:2)

2. He Admits his Ignorance (42:3, 5)

E. Lessons Learned

1. Bad things don't just happen to bad people

2. A moral life **untested** lacks true knowledge about and a true **relationship** with God

E. Lessons Learned

3. When we expect God to explain Himself, it **presumes** right, and accountability, and also the wisdom to understand His reasons.

4. A genuine relationship with the Creator, no matter how rocky, can withstand the pressures of life and suffering!
