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Principles of Mentoring

		The purpose of this lesson is to help the disciple/leader to discover both the need to be mentored and how to mentor others in the Lord.

	a.	: People follow you only because of your office. There is little mentoring here because people will not follow you beyond the boundaries of your authority.		
	b.	: People follow you out of a sense of personal debt for how you have helped them. The mentoring continues so long as the feeling of obligation exists.		
	C.	: People follow you because they do not feel that they can make it through life without you. The mentoring continues so long as you can continue to meet their needs.		
	d.	: People follow you because of what you have accomplished. The mentoring continues so long as the success continues.		
	e.	: People follow you because they know you and want to follow you. The mentoring continues so long as they like you.		
	f.	: People follow you because they share a common vision. The mentoring continues so long as you don't change.		
	g.	: People follow you because their eternal purpose and destiny was discovered, matured, and released under your mentoring. This mentoring relationship is based on spiritual identification and will last a lifetime.
