How Should Christians Respond?

1) Don't be -- you to the !

"But you, brothers and sisters, are not in the dark, for this day to surprise you like a thief. For you are all children of light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or the darkness." (vv. 4-5)

"He has rescued us from the domain of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of the Son he loves." (Col. 1:13)

2) -- and like you belong to the Lord!

"So then, let us not sleep, like the rest, but let us stay awake and be selfcontrolled. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be selfcontrolled and put on the armor of faith and love, and a helmet of the hope of salvation." (vv. 6-8)

"So now, little children, remain in him so that when he appears we may have confidence and not be ashamed before him at his coming." (1 John 2:28)
