Even recognizing that our messes are those of our own making or from the actions of others or because of the broken, sinful world in which we live, they can leave us seriously questioning God's faithfulness. In those moments many of us ask: Where is God in our trouble? Let's answer that question with today's study.

Main Situations:

- A boy's trouble 1 Samuel 3:10-14
- An elderly man's trouble 1 Samuel 8:1-9

Other Situations:

- The first trouble Genesis 3:8
- Disciples' trouble Luke 22; John 13-17
- Paul's trouble Acts 23:11

Lessons:

- All kinds of trouble happen
- · God moves toward us in our trouble
- We can choose to receive

Application:

- Know we are not alone
- Acknowledge His presence
- Receive His comfort and care
- Move to action

Conclusion:

God gets right into the middle of the trouble we face. He doesn't avoid it or avoid us. Our fears, frustrations and brokenness often lead us to think that He is distant and unconcerned. The truth is that in those tough circumstances He waits for us to simply turn to Him to find that He is there with us, to be our "ever present help in time of trouble."
