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**For Your Small Group's Thought and Talk**

Take no more than 5 minutes to quickly review the main points from Pastor Jeff's message. As you discuss the questions, don't expect to answer all of them. 1. If you were to describe to someone what Palm Sunday is about, what would you tell them?
2. Put yourself in the shoes of the donkey's owner. Why did you let these men take your donkey? Put the story into context today: Share how you have let "the Lord" use what might be precious to you. How hard was that for you to do?
3. Read **Luke 19:37** aloud. Describe that scene in your own words. Read **Luke 19:39-40**. Who are we more like today? Are we like the crowds in **Luke 19:37** or the Pharisees in **Luke 19:39**? How would you respond if someone said that Jesus needs to wake up some stones around our church?
4. Talk about what moved Jesus to weep over Jerusalem. How might that shape our response to the people and the city around us?
5. Is there one takeaway that the Lord calls your attention to?
