

Two thousand years ago, the Apostle John wrote these words for every follower of Jesus to ponder: "See how great a love the Father has bestowed upon us, that we would be called children of God." Then John added in, literally with gleeful delight: "And such we are!" (1 John 3:1). Wow! When you hear those words, you can only draw one conclusion: God loves kids! He really and truly does. So much so that He wants you and me, despite all our sinful baggage (our hurts, hang-ups and habits), to become His children. But hold on a minute. What exactly does it mean to be a child of God? The Apostle John knew the answer, and it got him so excited that he could hardly contain himself. Perhaps if you and I knew what John knew about being one of God's kids, our hearts would also resonate with praise to the Father in Heaven just like John's did. Let's give it a shot ...

FOR THOUGHT AND TALK

In your small group take 5-10 minutes to review the main points of Pastor John's message. Discuss the following questions, taking your time as the Spirit leads, realizing you don't have to cover them all.

- 1. Read aloud 1 John 3:3a and then choose an additional 5 or 6 other verses to read aloud from this message. What was the impact upon the 90+ year old Apostle John when he thought about being a child of God? What does it mean that God's love has been imported into our lives? Why is it important to be reminded *often* that we are children of God?
- 2. Describe what "childlike faith" is and what it is not. Matthew 18:32 says, "Unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." What are some ways of "turning" to Jesus, moment-by-moment?
- 3. Why is it so very important to constantly celebrate (like John did) that we are children of the Heavenly Father? What happens to you when you don't? When you do?
- 4. What was God speaking into your life from this message about *you* being *His* kid forever? How do you think what you heard can help make you happier and healthier in your walk with Jesus?
