

THE CHRISTIAN APPROACH TO LIVING

EPHESIANS 1:1-2

Previously, in last week's introduction to Ephesians, we learned that this particular New Testament book, perhaps more than any other book of the Bible, was written as a sort of "training manual" for the Christian life. In Ephesians, Paul tells us what a follower of Jesus Christ believes (chapters 1-3) and how a follower of Jesus Christ behaves (chapters 4-6). In other words, the Apostle lays out for us God's truth to learn and shows us how to live truly for God. With that premise in mind, Paul begins his letter with a greeting to his readers. However, since the letter of Ephesians is also a book of Scripture, then these opening words are no ordinary, "Hi, how y'all doing?" Rather, in the first two verses of chapter one, using himself as the example, Paul illustrates and instructs us on the Christian approach to living. Today we'll discover six key aspects of the right "life perspective" that God designed to guide us as we follow Jesus daily.
