Series Overview

Paul's letter to the Romans provides believers with a strong foundation for faith in Jesus Christ. Using this letter to introduce himself to the church in Rome, Paul develops and defends the truth of the gospel, encouraging believers to rely solely on God's grace for salvation. Paul begins by stating that all people are sinners and deserve God's judgement but then asserts that believers are free from sin's control, the demands of the law and fear of God's punishment. Paul explains that this freedom enables the believer to grow in their relationship with Jesus and live in the power of the Holy Spirit. This series will not only help you understand your faith, but it will enable you to give an account of the hope that lives within you to others!
